Meeting was called to order: The meeting was called to order at 5:05 pm.

Meeting opened with prayer: Pastor Dan Bailey led the meeting in prayer.

Introduction of participants. One-word responses:

I. Standing Business:

Diana asked if there were any additions or corrections on the July 26, 2022 minutes with no response.

A. Bradley Philbrick made a motion to approve the July 26, 2022 meeting minutes, Sr. Marlene Shapley seconded the motion, and all approved by unanimous vote of yeas.

B. John reported that as of July 31, the Coalition had a total cash balance of \$28,026.30: General fund \$17,952.72; Savings \$4,849.09 ; Prevention Matters \$1,853.67; Scholarship \$828.25; and DFC \$2,542.57.

As of July 31, 2022, DFC expenditures were \$27,941.07 (Total DFC FY2021 expenditures \$121,004.30}leaving a balance of \$42,150.52. DFC match is \$121,000.00.

The treasurer’s report was approved at the August 9th Executive Board Meeting.

C. Executive Director Report By Diana Hendricks:

1.Cate Vreede, MCPHD shared the Density Analysis of Incident Locations of Naloxone-EMS runs. This report on the statistics compiled by the MCPHD shows the number of naloxone kits and reported EMS runs for suspected Overdoses for the zip codes of the Beech Grove area, 46107 and 46203.

2. Diana introduced our guest speaker from Breathe Easy Beech Grove, Allison Aultman, the Tobacco Program Coordinator of the Marion County Public Health Department. She serves as the advisor for program design, implementation, and evaluation of tobacco control initiatives on behalf of Smoke Free Indy and MCPHD. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Health Science from Ball State University and a Master of Public Health in Public Health Administration from Indiana University-Bloomington. She has also been a Certified Health Education Specialist since 2015.

She was joined by Taylor Williams, Advocacy Specialist with the Indiana Lung Association of Indiana. Taylor is from Tipton, Indiana and an alumnus of Franklin College. She works with TPC funded counties across the state on indicator 5 which is smokefree worksites. Taylor is passionate about policy work and guiding coalitions to make institutional changes that will make healthier communities. Taylor is on her local board of directors for Tipton Community Theatre and will be co-directing Matilda the Musical this fall.

Allison and Taylor discussed the Tobacco Industry and how they are targeting their vaping commercials to youth and certain communities. They discussed statistics related to youth tobacco and vaping use and shared data on why youth report they are using. Please see the attached presentation in the Recap.
