Kimberly called the meeting to order at 5:03 pm.
Pastor Dan Bailey led the meeting in prayer.
Introduction of participants. One-word responses:

I. Standing Business:

- A. Approval of the February 22, 2022 Meeting Minutes. **Ben Mosier motioned to approve the November meeting minutes, John Parks seconded the motion, and all approved by unanimous vote of yea.**
- B. John reported that as of February 28, 2022, the Coalition had a total cash balance of \$7,025.11; General Fund \$3,222.86; Savings \$535.82; Prevention Matters \$1,853.67; Scholarship \$1,328.25; and DFC \$84.51
- C. As of February 28, 2022, DFC expenditures were \$42,827.06 leaving a balance of \$118,887.85. DFC match is \$40,000.00. Diana announced that the Treasurer’s Report was approved at the March 8, 2022, Executive Board Meeting.
- D. Executive Director Report- Diana Hendricks
 1. At this time the Coalition has 43 Partners (organizations) and 98 members across our 12 sectors. Our need for membership is more youth and parents.
 2. New class scheduled: Fundamentals of Strategic Prevention Framework (SPF)--Understand how SPF strengthens sustainability for non-profit organizations. Presenter-Diana Hendricks & Alison Muckerheide are offering a SPF Brown Bag training, Friday, April 22, 2022, from 11:30 am– 1:00 pm Training is free for all CDFC partners.

Diana introduced our Special Guest Speaker, Stephanie R. Lancaster, Director of Community Health Solutions for Indiana, Ohio, and West Virginia for Community Health Solutions for Indiana. Stephanie reported that the statistics for overdoses are reported by three groups: Any Opioid; Synthetic drugs, and Heroin. Addiction is a disease of the brain that usually begins with opioids then leads to heroin. Fentanyl has become the latest problem. Other drugs laced with Fentanyl are usually the reason for many overdoses. Narcan has become the emerging treatment of drug overdose by the AMA. Improving the access to Naloxone has been part of Governor Holcomb’s agenda and made possible by such public service groups like Overdose Lifeline who has provided dispensers in local areas.

Kim began the discussion of the remainder of the meeting.

- a. Marketing-Alison Muckerheide reported that this week is National Drug & Alcohol Facts Week, and the coalition promoted the national campaign through a billboard on Emerson Avenue and a Facebook Infographic. Alison informed the coalition that April 25th-29th is National Youth Violence Prevention Week (Sandy Hook Promise) and the coalition will provide a social media infographic. Alison shared that National Prevention Week is May 8th – 14th and the coalition will partner with The Beech Grove branch of the Indianapolis Public Library to promote NPW through decorating the display case and youth activities.
- b. Marketing-Ben Mosier announced that the partners tab on the Website is now up and available for partners to sign onto. Ben will highlight the partners tab at our April meeting.

2. Community Events & Activities

- a. Diana shared a festival activity the executive board is considering for sustainability purposes. She has been approached by several groups and there will be more information at the next meeting.
- b. The Beech Grove Promoters Club have agreed that the coalition will be doing the 50/50 drawing sales at the July 3rd Fireworks at Sarah Bolton Park. They will split their 50 percent with the coalition. More information and a volunteer sign-up sheet will be coming soon.
