Meeting was called to order: Kimberly called the meeting to order at 5:03 pm.

Meeting opened with prayer: Sr Marlene Shapley led the meeting in prayer.

Introduction of participants. One-word responses: What does summer mean to you?

I. Standing Business:

Kim asked if there were any additions or corrections on the April 26, 2022 minutes with no response.

A. Sr. Marlene Shapley motioned to approve the April 26, 2022 meeting minutes, John Parks seconded the motion, and all approved by unanimous vote of yea.

B. John reported that as of April 30, 2022, the Coalition had a total cash balance of \$13,224.46: General fund \$4,786.67; Savings \$4,436.36; Prevention Matters \$1,853.67; Scholarship \$1,328.25; and DFC \$819.51.

As of April 30, 2022, DFC expenditures were \$66,026.14 leaving a balance of \$97,129.30. DFC match is \$65,019.00. The treasurer's report was approved at the May 10th Executive Board Meeting.

C. Executive Director Report by Diana Hendricks:

1. Diana introduced our newest partner, Don Bender of the Indianapolis Youth Leadership Academy. We will be partnering with them on youth and adult prevention programming.

Special Guest Speaker: Liz Benitez, LSW Program Director of Residential Treatment Center at Valle Vista Health System.

She discussed the RTC program at Calle Vista which provides mental health/addiction treatment to at risk teens ages 12 to 18 in the Indiana area. Although Valle Vista is located in Johnson County, they accept referrals (DCS, Probation, Private) from across the state. Their program provides a structured and safe place for teens to have their basic needs met while they can focus on rehabilitation and recovery. They have a four-phase program which youth have to complete prior to being discharged. The usual stay is from six to nine months depending on youth level improvement. They provide individual and family therapy working towards family reunification; learning life skills, and recreation therapy. One of their seasonal activities includes vegetable and flower gardening. They harvest the vegetables and sell them to hospital staff. She discussed aftercare where youth and their families must participate for up to a year. You may contact her at:

 - a. Alison gave a highlight of the NPW activities at the Beech Grove Library that was attended by 30 adults and youth. It was also featured on the coalition Facebook Page.
 - b. July 3rd Freedom Festival with Fireworks by the Promoters Club, coalition members will be present to sell 50/50 raffle tickets and pass out trifolds. If your organization would like to include a flier, please contact Diana for the printing size and they will be included in the trifold. We need 20 volunteers to sell raffle tickets. There is a sign-up sheet for coalition members to volunteer for either shift from 6 to 7:30 pm or 7:30 to 9 pm. Youth volunteers may pass out trifolds, but adults must sell the raffle tickets. The coalition will share the 50% donation with the Beech Grove Promoters Club. There will be food trucks and a DJ before the fireworks at Sarah Bolton Park. Bring lawn chairs, blankets, and bug spray.
 - c. The planning has begun for the Client Appreciation Party scheduled in August.
 - d. The dates for the Beech Grove Fall Festival will e September 14th thru the 17th. The coalition will have a booth again this year for National Prevention Week and Kim offered to present Narcan demos.
 - e. Diana reported about the Mayor's Clean City Initiative event on May 14th at City Hall and shared a photo of the coalition's booth. We collected 100lbs of unused medicine and 12 boxes of used syringes and EpiPens. BG Middle School Boy to Men joined us and did a fabulous job handing out trifolds and Deterra pouches. There was also an opportunity for free paper shredding and recycling of old appliances.
