Chairman, Kimberly Sharp called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m..

Pastor Dan Bailey opened with prayer.

Introduction of participants. One-word responses: Tell about your July 4<sup>th</sup> traditions or what you will be doing this year

I. Standing Business:

Kim asked if there were any additions or corrections on the May 24, 2022 minutes with no response.

- A. *Sr. Marlene Shapley motioned to approve the May 24, 2022 meeting minutes, Richard Compton seconded the motion, and all approved by unanimous vote of yea.*
- B. Diana gave the Treasurer’s Report for John Parks . The Coalition has of May 31, 2022, had a total cash balance of \$20,888.01: General fund \$4,215.14; Savings \$4,436.44 ; Prevention Matters \$1,853.67; Scholarship \$1,328.25; and DFC \$9,054.51.  
As of May 31, 2022, DFC expenditures were \$79,990.44 leaving a balance of \$83,164.83. DFC match is \$65,019.00. The treasurer’s report was approved at the June 14th Executive Board Meeting.

C. Executive Director Report

- 1. Diana introduced our coalition Scholarship Winner, Sophia Simon and her mother. Sophia graduated from Beech Grove High School in 2022 and applied for the Coalition \$1,000.00 scholarship for a student enrolled in a Health-Related Field. Sophia read her winning essay. She received half of the monetary award now and the other half in November. She will be attending the Indiana University Nursing Program.
- 2. Diana introduced our guest speaker, Donald Bender of the Indianapolis Youth Leadership Academy. Donald Bender gave a presentation on the Indianapolis Youth Leadership Academy. This week-long program for youth ages 15 to 18 is provided free for those youth who are referred to the program. The criteria for acceptance is Good Character, a Desire to is Learn and a Desire to be a Leader. Don discussed how this week-long program prepares youth for leadership roles in their community through using the Servant Leadership Belief System to teach character traits, the Gallagher Leadership method and test, and the Bill of Rights. The course also educates youth on stress management techniques, social media safe use and the effect it can have on your life, as well as other important traits of great leadership. Don shared, “Successful people lead, and the earlier the knowledge and skills of leadership are acquired the more successful an individual will be in life. The IYLA’s one week training program provides young men and women with the knowledge and leadership skills to teach, coach, direct, and support those who are working with one another, to effectively solve problems and accomplish missions.”

3. Assessment, Planning, Evaluation
  - a. Diana informed coalition members that our DFC evaluator will be administering a coalition evaluation to members during the month of July. Diana asked everyone to participate as it will assist us in being a more effective prevention organization.

  - a. Diana informed coalition members that she and Alison are participating in SAMSHA's Sustainability Intense to develop a sustainability plan for the coalition to include diversifying funding, building a portfolio, and local norms guidelines related to substance use. This falls right in line with DFC funding requirement that CDFC produce a sustainability plan by year three of the grant funding cycle.
3. Ad Hoc Projects
  - a. Alison updated the coalition members on our Alternate/drug-free social event Community Art Classes in collaboration with Cheerie Joy Studio. We are providing support for 16 students to take 6 weeks of art classes each Tuesday as a form of prosocial involvement to increase emotional expression in a healthy manner.
