Meeting was called to order by Chairman, Kimberly Sharp at 5:05 pm.

Pastor Dan Bailey opened the meeting with prayer.

**I. Standing Business:**

Kim asked if there were any additions or corrections on the June 22, 2022 minutes with no response.

A. Bradley Philbrick motioned to approve the June 22, 2022 meeting minutes, Chip Zapp seconded the motion, and all approved by unanimous vote of yea.

B. John reported that as of June 30, 2022, the Coalition had a total cash balance of \$13,649.05: General Fund \$2,201.24; Savings \$4,436.51; Prevention Matters \$1,853.67; Scholarship \$828.25; and DFC \$4,329.38. As of June 30, 2022, DFC expenditures were \$13,073.24 (total grant period \$93,063.24) leaving a balance of \$70,091.59. DFC match is \$92,990.00. The treasurer’s report was approved at the July 11, 2022 Executive Board Meeting.

C. Executive Director Report By Diana Hendricks:

**Guest Speaker:** Kim Sharp introduced our Guest Speaker, Jennie Voelker, LCSW, Clinical Director of Youth Services for Community Fairbanks Behavioral Health Services for Youth and Families. She is a licensed Clinical Social Worker with over 20 years of behavioral health experience at Community Health Network. As Clinical Director since 2017, she works with all behavioral health programs serving children, adolescents, and families to assure clinical alignment and best practice. Their motto is Exceptional Care Simply Delivered. In 1956, Fairbanks joined the Community Health Network.

These services include: Therapy; Skills Training; Psychiatric and Psychosocial Assessments; Case Management and Treatment Planning; Crisis Assessment and Intervention; Nicotine Dependence Treatment and Pain Management. Their program is based on SAMSHA’s definition “Recovery and

Resilience Trauma". This evidence based care treats mental health and substance abuse concurrently. They provide school based services and several treatment facilities for youth ages 5 thru 18. They also support youth who are transferring out of foster care. To contact Jennie:
